Nursery rhymes provide bite-sized learning opportunities for young children to develop key skills. They are a powerful learning source in early literacy and enable children to become interested in the rhythm and patterns of language. Rhymes are fantastic vocabulary boosters and often feature a pleasing rhythmic pattern and simple repetitive phrases that young children find easy to remember and repeat. Experts in literacy and child development have discovered that if children know eight nursery rhymes by heart by the time they're four years old, they're usually among the best readers by the time they're eight. 
